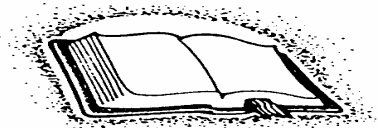

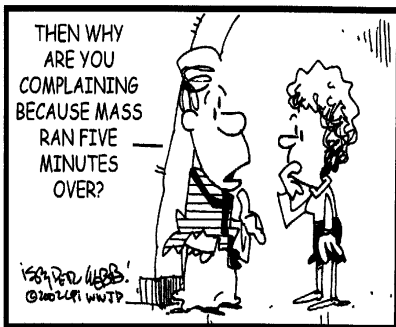
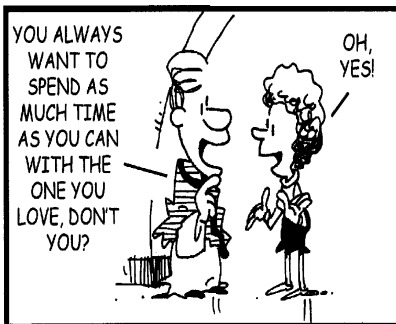

Dear Friends,

Our readings remind us that religious piety and sacrificial offerings mean little to our God apart from love and mercy offered in a spirit of praise and faithfulness. We are called in our first reading to see Abraham as a model for our faith and trust in God. Our gospel quotes Jesus as saying "It is mercy I seek, not sacrifice."

Just as Jesus called the unlikely Matthew to be His disciple, He asks us to open our hearts to His call when and where it comes to us. If we are to be the people God wants us to be and do the job He intends us to do, we must live up to the standard of love and truth in our daily behavior.

Many young people have received a passport into their next level of life through the congratulations of Graduation. Many have answered the call to do their best and reach high levels of success. We recognize many who have attained this level at SCCS.

Area organizations awarded 37 post secondary scholarships to 37 SMCC students. \$3,000,000 in college/university scholarships were offered to the SMCC class of 2008 from 42 colleges and universities. SCCS foundation presented several post secondary scholarships to our seniors.

The Bishop's Cross, the highest award in a Catholic High School, is awarded to one young man and one young woman. The 2008 awards were given to Kayle Kaman and Matthew Lasnowski. Congratulations to the Valedictorian, Aaron Ebert and Salutatorian, Brian Jordan.

Our eighth graders moving into ninth grade at SMCC received a total of 16 scholarship awards.

Our sophomores received 'top results' on the OGT (Ohio Graduation Tests). Every Ohio high school student must pass all five parts in order to graduate from high school. The results were: Reading - 100%, Math - 98%, Writing - 100%, Science - 93%, Social Studies - 98%. SMCC hits all A or a 97.8% average on the OGT. Terrific performance!

Our grade school students have performed measurable increases in the new computer-based Scantron testing program. SCCS Pre-school - Grade School all performed in end of the year spring music programs. Field day participation brought ribbon collections as well as demonstrations of personal best.

Thanks to parents and friends, the students celebrated a Spring Fling, picnics, and field trips at all grade levels.

A power-packed year in athletics, a terrific success in Model UN and a record breaking academic challenge team to mention a few more successes that made this a super year at Sandusky Central Catholic School.

Thank you, parishioners, for your support. Thank you, volunteers, for making so many good things happen.

We will be saying good-bye to some of our faculty and staff who are retiring or just moving on.
